At present there are only four of us but we will be recruiting more people to help us run the Trust. We are sharing responsibility for all the associated tasks - admin, accounts, fund-raising, events etc, although Linda is currently first point of contact for membership and most events. ## Membership

We have set ourselves a target to get a minimum of 60 members in 2015. Please help us to achieve this! Introduce a friend or two and we will soon be there. So far 25 people have taken out annual membership for the year to 31 May 2016.

On short sailings we offer a taster membership for 1 week at £5 per head and hope this will encourage people to try wherry sailing at a very modest cost. Our annual membership is only £10 and members can then sail with us at no charge. ### Events this year so far

Our first event was a talk to the Civil Service Sailing Club at Rutland Water by Linda and Joe. That was as a result of Joe's contact with their organiser. They were very enthusiastic about Maud and her history and will now be coming to visit Maud at Stalham in early September and come for a sail on her. After our talk a collection was made, making a useful first contribution to funds.

Then, in May, Maud paid a 3-day visit to TIMOR, the Thurne Mouth Open Regatta, and offered short sailings in the evenings. The Eastern Region of the Arthur Ransome Society also paid us a visit, having been unable to make a booking with either of the other wherry charities.

June saw Maud on the Yare with visits to Hardley Windmill and to the Ferry House at Surlingham on the occasion of the Yare Sailing Club's 30th Anniversary. We went for short sailings and gained some new friends and members. We plan to return to both Hardley and Surlingham in 2016.
